No Surprises Act, effective January 1, 2022
Notice of Right to Receive a Good Faith Estimate
(applicable to private pay patients in our practice)

Under the No Surprises Act of January 2022, you have the right under the law to receive a “Good Faith Estimate” explaining how much your medical care will cost.

Health care providers need to provide an estimate of the cost of non-emergency medical items and services to patients who do not have insurance or who are not using insurance for pay for these health care services.

(1) You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for the total expected cost of any non-emergency items or services. This includes related costs like medical tests, prescription drugs, equipment, and hospital fees.

At Boston Sensory Solutions, this includes the cost of Occupational Therapy Evaluation and Treatment services, each billed at \$150/ session. (Specific codes & details provided in each individualized Good Faith Estimate.)

(2) You will be given a Good Faith Estimate in writing at least 1 business day before your services begin. We strive to provide this at the time you book your appointments.

(3). You can also ask our clinic manager for a Good Faith Estimate before you schedule a service.

(4) If you receive a bill that is at least \$400 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.

(5) Make sure to save a copy of your Good Faith Estimate.
